Vista and an interested organisation are implementing the ACCESS program to improve access to family planning (FP) and comprehensive post-abortion care (PAC) through primary health care (PHC) services. This initiative addresses stigma, misinformation, and systemic barriers that limit women and adolescents' access to sexual and reproductive health (SRH) services in Nigeria. Sustained improvement in SRH outcomes requires not only service delivery but also a robust enabling policy environment and strengthened institutional and human resource capacity. Therefore, a key focus of the ACCESS program is on policy domestication to integrate program priorities into state and local health systems, and capacity building for healthcare providers to ensure high-quality, stigma-free SRH service delivery. Crucially, local Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) will be engaged as vital partners to drive community engagement, awareness campaigns, and support policy domestication efforts.

Through community-led demand generation, health system strengthening, and strategic engagement at all levels, the ACCESS program aims to reduce stigma, expand service uptake, and deliver high-quality SRH services. This effort is aligned with national priorities under the RMMCAEH+N strategy and PHC revitalization agenda, with the overarching goal of reducing maternal morbidity and mortality by sustainably integrating SRH services into the broader health system

The TA will support the State Government, through the Client, to strengthen governance and policy environments to integrate ACCESS program priorities into state and local health systems; and build the capacity of healthcare providers and government institutions to deliver high-quality, stigma-free SRH services, significantly leveraging the role of local CSOs.

   Support states to domesticate abortion policies while clarifying legal indications for management of miscarriages.

  Deliver specialized training on manual vacuum aspiration (MVA), post-abortion family planning (PAFF) counselling, infection prevention, and other SRH protocols.

  Facilitate workshops on Value Clarification and Attitude Transformation (VCAT) to address provider biases and improve respectful, nonjudgmental client interactions.

  Set up clinical mentorship programs, pairing trained supervisors with healthcare providers to ensure ongoing skill improvement and supportive supervision.

- c. Infrastructure and Equipment Support (as relevant to policy/capacity):

  Assist in guiding the renovation and setup of consultation rooms in PHCs to ensure privacy and a conductve service delivery environment, adhering to policy standards.

  Support the identification and procurement processes for essential medical supplies, including MVA kits, misoprostol, combi-packs, contraceptives, and waste management systems, ensuring alignment with state policies.
